## **Henry (Harry) Dingle M.M.**

Harry was granted Farm 55 near Hanwood, Griffith NSW in May 1913.

Walking off and forfeiting his block he enlisted for World War 1 in June 1915 at age 21 serving in the  $1^{\rm st}$  Field Ambulance Reinforcements on the Western Front.

He was awarded the Victory Medal and achieved the rank of 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant.

While instructing, Harry was accidentally killed age 23 during a training exercise at Pozieres, France.

He is buried at the Dernancourt Communal Cemetery, France
