

Henry (Harry) Dingle M.M.

Harry was granted Farm 55 near Hanwood, Griffith NSW in May 1913.

Walking off and forfeiting his block he enlisted for World War 1 in June 1915 at age 21 serving in the 1st Field Ambulance Reinforcements on the Western Front.

He was awarded the Victory Medal and achieved the rank of 2nd Lieutenant.

While instructing, Harry was accidentally killed age 23 during a training exercise at Pozieres, France.

He is buried at the Dernancourt Communal Cemetery, France
